Very Cool UU Advent Calendar Recognizes Unitarian & Universalist Ancestors with Foundational Roles in Many Winter Holidays


WorshipWeb (a Facebook group curated by UU minister Erika Hewitt) has posted beautiful and informative images, all created by Ralph Roberts, also a UU minister. These are meant to help <u>specifically UUs</u> count down the days in December to Christmas Eve (December 24).

Many of the historic milestones in this Advent calendar aren't necessarily recognized on the precise day that they're celebrated (for example, Kwanzaa is recognized here on December 2nd instead of December 26th, and the December 12th image recognizes Clara Barton's birthday (December 25, 1821).

More than perfect historic accuracy this calendar is offered in the spirit of holding up and delighting in the ways that our Unitarian and our Universalist ancestors had a foundational role in many of the winter holidays.
