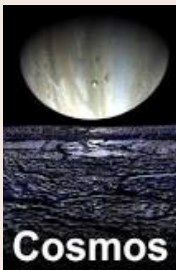

## 25th Anniversary: Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

In observance of this milestone, the ADA National Network has prepared an ADA Anniversary Tool Kit, which includes publications, events, videos and other resources.

They are also calling for individuals, organizations and faith communities, including individual congregations, to sign a proclamation to recommit to full implementation of the ADA. The Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) is one of the faith communities that has signed this proclamation. [EqUUal Access](#), the UU organization committed to the full engagement of people with disabilities in our congregations and beyond, will also be releasing a resources for congregations probably by the July 26th anniversary of the ADA.
